



HumanCare Russia

The HumanCare Russia association was founded in Bethlehem Parish on January 30, 2010. The association's purpose is to facilitate the humanitarian work in our friendly church in Moscow, which Connie Meyer worked for from 1992 to 2019, when she passed away. The humanitarian work continues in collaboration with some of Connie Meyer's former assistants in the church.

Association's statutes

§ 1 The name of the association is HumanCare Russia

§ 2 The association is headquartered in Copenhagen.

§ 3 The purpose of the association is to facilitate the humanitarian work in an Orthodox congregation in Moscow in various ways for the benefit of families, individuals and projects.

§ 4 The association is funded by membership fees, gifts, fund applications, etc. Clauses on gifts must be respected.

§ 5 The membership fee is set by the general meeting. Membership is obtained by paying a membership fee.

§ 6 The association is managed by a board of 3 to a maximum of 5 members elected at the general meeting. The board constitutes itself. The members of the board are elected for 2 years. Re-election is possible. In even-numbered years, 2 members of the board are up for election and in odd-numbered years, the rest of the members are up for election. 1 alternate is elected for 2 years. 1 auditor is elected for 2 years. The board holds at least 3 meetings annually, and as often as deemed necessary. Exceptionally, meetings can be held as telephone-skype meetings. The board regularly informs the members about economy, special needs and the current situation in Moscow through an information letter (primarily by email). Members without email are accommodated by ordinary mail. The board edits and maintains the association's website.

§ 7 The general meeting is the association's highest authority and is held annually and no later than April 30. The notice of the general meeting must be sent to the members via information letter 3 weeks before the meeting.

§ 8 The association's financial year is the calendar year. Audited and signed accounts must be available before the general meeting.

§ 9 The association's daily management is carried out by the executive committee consisting of a chairman, vice chairman and treasurer. The executive committee draws the association externally.

§10 Amendments to these articles of association require a 2/3 majority at an ordinary general meeting. Resolution on dissolution of the association shall be made by the general meeting with a 2/3 majority at two consecutive meetings held at least 14 days and no more than 1 month apart. In the event of dissolution, the general meeting shall decide on the use of any surplus in accordance with the association's purpose.
